

UNDERHILL PARK UPDATE

Mumbles Rugby Club have started work on further improvements to the flooding problem in Underhill Park. This follows on from the successful work they carried out last year when three drain away trenches were created which substantially reduced the flooding which had plagued the park for many years. The club also carried out major improvements to the main rugby pitch. This year they will be digging a further three trenches as well as

putting in new drainage pipes under the main rugby pitch. They will then spread sand and fertilizer before sowing grass seed on worn areas of the pitch. All of this work would not be possible without significant funding from Mumbles Community Council and Sports Wales and there is no doubt the whole community will benefit from the work being carried out by Mumbles Rugby Club.

THE CITY & COUNTY OF SWANSEA (C&CS) IS THE RELEVANT PLANNING **AUTHORITY AND IT IS THEIR** RESPONSIBILITY TO DECIDE ON ALL PLANNING APPLICATIONS IN SWANSEA AND GOWER.

Mumbles Community Council (MCC) is sent copies of planning applications in our area and makes comment on these plans. MCC can decide to recommend approval or refusal, or approval subject to conditions such as

Central to the decision making process are material considerations - issues that are, in law, material or relevant to a planning application. Such matters must be taken into account when making a recommendation on a planning application.

Material considerations include:

- the planning authority's development plan
- a site's planning history (including earlier applications)
- accessibility
- traffic
- roads and parking
- archaeology
- a community survey, plan or design statement.

materials, maximum size, parking or access arrangements.

A few decisions are made by the C&CS's twelve Councillor Planning Committee members, but most decisions are delegated to Planning Officers

Whilst C&CS doesn't have to agree, it must consider the community view.

We welcome your comments, whether you oppose or support an application, and will take these into consideration when making our recommendations.

Some planning applications seek approval for development in principle through outline planning permission. If plans are not properly considered at this stage, it is often too late to express concern when the full details of agreed outline proposals come before the council at a later date.

DEMOCRACY FOR EVER!

ON WEDNESDAY 18TH MARCH AT OYSTERMOUTH SCHOOL LOCAL SCHOOL COUNCILS WERE ABLE TO PITCH THEIR IDEAS TO MUMBLES COMMUNITY COUNCIL. SIX SCHOOL COUNCILS HAD PREVIOUSLY MET TO DRAW UP A SHORTLIST OF IDEAS. THE IDEAS PRESENTED AT THE SPECIAL **MEETING WERE:**

- 1. To move and decorate the skateboard ramp at Blackpill. After questions and discussions on the necessity and cost of moving the ramp, it was suggested that the Council could look into alternative sites and costs for a smaller ramp which younger children could use. This was suggested by Whitestone School
- 2. An "Adopt an Older Person" scheme, where children could visit older people in the area to combat loneliness and offer help and support. All agreed that this was a superb



idea. There would be legal problems to overcome but it was felt that, if possible, the Council could help establish this scheme, particularly through the Older Persons' Festival in the Autumn. This idea was presented by Oystermouth School council.

3. Whitestone School also suggested that there should be a talent show for local children. It was felt that this could take place during the October half term as part of the Teen Festival.

There were a number of brilliant ideas which unfortunately didn't make the shortlist. Keep the ideas coming!

It was felt that the exercise was very useful and should be repeated and that the Community Council and school councils should work together more often.

Above all it was great fun!

Mumbles Community Council's grant of £1,000 will be used to fund our Sculpture by the Sea UK Festival project. Firstly, five art workshops will be run by our team of artists in June/July term time for all five of our Mumbles primary schools to create festival flags and displays to use at our annual Sculpture by the Sea UK Festival at Bracelet Bay and Blackpill in July 2015. Artist workshops will then be run at the festival. The festival is a two day event led by trained artists and involves people of all ages taking part in an activity on the beach to create sculptures whilst engaging with the place and nature. We have been running this local festival for ten years so have built up a following of participants each year and the preliminary workshops with the schools ensures that the community is connected with

the event through the children who come and take part and in the festival. The festival workshops are both environmental and sustainable as materials used are found - i.e. sand, shells, pebbles etc. and are designed to educate, inspire and delight, touching all the



senses to really experience making art. Last year's 2014 event (sponsored by Mumbles Community Council & CCS) is featured on our website.
